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History of RSVP

RSVP is one of the three Senior Corps programs run by the Corporation for National and Community Service. The other two Senior Corps programs are the Foster Grandparent Program (FGP) and the Senior Companion Program (SCP). Senior Corps is the nation's largest organization for volunteers age 55 and over. Volunteers with the Foster Grandparent Program tutor or mentor children with special needs. Volunteers with the senior companion program assist frail older adults to help them maintain their independence in their homes. Both foster grandparent and senior companion volunteers serve between 15 and 40 hours each week.

RSVP is differs in that volunteers can serve in a variety of opportunities with flexible hours.

Senior Corps projects can be found in every state, as well as the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands. Senior Corps volunteers support more than 70,000 nonprofit and public agencies across the country.

All Senior Corps programs are supported by CNCS headquarters staff as well as 47 field offices or State Offices spread out across the country.

RSVP was established in 1971. Each year, 296,000 RSVP volunteers serve through 685 RSVP projects spread out across the country.
